WHAT IS THE CHALLENGE?

Share amazing ideas to prevent bullying in your school, community, online or wherever you see it and then get help to make it happen.

WHO CAN ENTER?

All K-12 students have the opportunity to submit amazing ideas on how to address and prevent bullying in their schools, in communities, or online for the chance to receive funding and support to help make it happen. Please be sure to have an adult submit on your behalf. Ideally this should be the teacher, parent or other grownup who you worked with to come up with the amazing idea.

WHEN IS THE CHALLENGE?

Entries will be accepted online from the opening date of September 27, 2021 through the deadline of November 15, 2021.

WHAT IS THE COST?

It's free to enter!

HOW DO YOU ENTER?

Submissions can be made by adults on behalf of youth, either groups or individuals, and prizes will be awarded to their school or organization. Complete all information in the online submission form. Send any images or documents to bullying411@pacer.org, along with contact information.

WHAT DOES EVERYONE RECEIVE?

Everyone who submits an entry is eligible to participate in a free, weekly live video series (six total) led by PACER's National Bullying Prevention Center staff, to be held in early 2022 with bullying prevention education for youth, as well as Q&A sessions on implementing bullying prevention ideas. The series will also be archived to watch on future dates.

HOW ARE WINNING SUBMISSIONS SELECTED?

- A panel will review all ideas submitted
- Two submissions will be chosen by the panel for the monetary award and direct assistance
- Those selected will be notified by PACER's National Bullying Prevention Center

WHAT DO WINNING SUBMISSIONS RECEIVE?

- \$500 for each of the two winning submissions to help implement their TAKE ON BULLYING idea
- During early 2022, winners will receive individualized instruction, education, and support through six, 60-minute
 video presentations, led by PACER's National Bullying Prevention Center staff, to help facilitate implementation
 of their TAKE ON BULLYING idea
